This grant provides up to \$500 to cover fees associated with: the disposal of general or green waste; purchasing compost; and reimbursing community groups green bin charges. Applications to this grant are assessed monthly.



The scheme is available for a wide range of assistance including: Equipment Assistance; Special Events Assistance; and Elite Athletes Assistance. Grants in the scheme are awarded to clubs on a dollar for dollar basis. Applications may be submitted at any time of the year, however, they will only be presented for approval at the end of May and November with \$3500 available. Applications must be forwarded to the Sport and Recreation Officer by the end of May or November for an assessment.


